President's Message

The year 2005 is flying by so quickly and the Doane Family Association is trying to keep up with the pace. We informed you in the Fall 2004 *Doane Family News* that we had lost our paper trail in Cape Cod in our endeavors to prove the origins of Deacon John Doane. Well, we're not stopping there. We have embarked on a genetic genealogy project through DNA testing procedures. Please refer to an article in this publication under that subject. Our committee is excited about this project as we endeavor to locate volunteers in the United Kingdom to help us find Deacon John Doane's roots.

At the 2004 reunion we announced that our investments in the endowment fund and the Hattie Belle Doane Van Hoy Memorial Fund were flat for the year up to that date. However, we are now pleased to inform you that the last six months bounced back very healthily, and we did realize a 11-12 percent increase in both of these accounts. At the end of 2004, we had \$280,000 in USB Financial, and \$79,000 in Hilliard Lyons (Book Account). We do have the financial backing to support further research of the Deacon.

We have lost another strong supporter of DFA — Don Fineout of Haslett, MI. Don has been a devoted attendee of our reunions, and has encouraged his whole family to become involved. He also helped in forming the new Great Lakes Chapter in 2003. His son, Bill, is the new Chaplain of our Association. Our heartfelt sympathy and love go out to the whole Fineout family.

We have made a deposit with the University of California at Davis (30 miles west of Sacramento, CA) for our 2006 biennial reunion. Chairperson for the event will be Eunice Brabec. The California del Norte Chapter is expecting to hold their 2005 chapter reunion in the area and start making plans for 2006. Anyone wishing to make a presentation at the 2006 DFA reunion should contact Eunice. Her address is in the DFA officers and committees listing in this newsletter under Membership.

The Doane Family Foundation was able to make scholarship awards to four Doane College students for the 2004-2005 school year. These awards totaled \$6,000 and were in addition to the scholarship awarded to Paul Doane of Northern California. Please keep the foundation in mind for memorials and estate planning.

This is the first year that Mary and I have spent at 7,200 feet elevation during the wintry weather in many years, and I must say, it has been quite enjoyable. Our biggest snowstorm was 22 inches, and the coldest it got was about seven degrees. We have had three times the moisture this winter than many previous years, and the reservoirs are full again. Hopefully, we won't have a serious forest fire problem this coming summer. BUT, I can't wait for the golf course to open.

GENETIC GENEALOGY (DNA)

Dick Doane mentioned in his "President's Message" that your association has embarked on a new program to try to determine the ancestry of Deacon John Doane, since our paper trail in Cape Cod has seemed to come to an end. This past October a steering committee was appointed, composed of Virgil Doan (UT), Derck Done (UK), Kay Blair, (VA), and Dick Doane (AZ), to establish a genetic testing program that would hopefully lead to an absolute conclusion of the origin of the Deacon.

Genetic testing for genealogy purposes has become quite popular among family groups, but is still in its infancy, having just started to spread widely in the year 2000. It has been determined by geneticists that the male y-chromosome is passed down through direct male descendants from generation to generation, with very little change. Therefore, any Doan/Doane/Done/Donne male can be traced to his ancestry back as far as 500 generations. In contrast, the female x-chromosome is only passed down to other female descendants and the Doan/Doane/Done/Donne name is lost. When passed to the male descendants, 50 percent is lost the first generation and 25 percent is lost in subsequent generations.

Genetic testing entails the acquisition of a DNA sample from the person participating in the Family Surname Project. This is a very simple procedure that requires the scraping of saliva inside the cheek and depositing it in a vial for mailing to the laboratory.

The steering committee researched several companies and determined that FamilyTreeDNA was best suited for our program. This company appears to be the leading genetic genealogy research company. They use the University of Arizona testing facility, which is the leading genetic research institute worldwide. They also will keep the DNA samples on file for 25 years, which would enable us to do future testing if new research provides more accurate results. FamilyTreeDNA, located in Ft. Worth, TX, has been in business since early 2000, and has over 1,500 Family Surname Projects in the works at present, and over 28,000 tests on file. You can access their website at www.familytreedna.com. You will be amazed at

the amount of information on this site, if you type in the name Doan, or Doane, or Done, or Donne, in project site. There you can review the results of those who have been tested to date. Tests are by number only, not by name, for privacy protection. Only our Project Administrator, Virgil Doan, (and the Steering Committee) knows the identity of the participants.

In reviewing this information you will note that there are various types of tests available. The initial test of y-12 markers can usually classify close relatives, and is the least expensive. They can also test for y-25 and y-37 markers, which will take you back many more generations.

The DFA Executive Committee has committed \$2,000 to begin this Family Surname Project, and the Steering Committee selected three descendants from Deacon John Doane's sons, (John, Jr., Daniel, and Ephraim) to take the initial tests. They also selected two Done descendants from different lines who live here in the U. S., plus Derek Done who lives in the UK. The initial y-12 marker was present as noted in the test results. The Steering Committee then decided to further test four or five of these members to the y-25 level and one to the y-37 level.

We will now concentrate our efforts to find Done/Donne family volunteers in the United Kingdom, who know their pedigree, to participate in our Surname Project. We know that we will have to fund these tests as there is no reason for us to expect someone in the UK to help us find our ancestry. We do not expect this to be an easy or timely endeavor, but be assured we do have the financial resources to hopefully accomplish this goal. (See President's Message). This being said, any Doan/Doane/Done/Donne family direct male descendent may participate in this Surname Project at his own expense. You can go to our website, www.familytreedna.com/public/doane, and fill out an order form. The basic y-12 marker test costs \$99 plus postage. We will do our best to keep everyone informed of our progress and make special mailings if deemed important enough to do so. We will also be updating information on our website at "FamilyTreeDNA" from time to time.

AUTHOR RUTH DOAN MACDOUGALL

The newest book by Ruth Doan MacDougall is *Henrietta Snow*, a sequel to *The Cheerleader and Snowy*. MacDougall has written 11 novels as well as numerous short stories and book reviews. Her novels are all set in her beloved New Hampshire. Ruth was born on a chicken farm near Laconia, N. H. After Dartmouth, her father Daniel Doane, had taken up chicken farming with the idea that he could both raise chickens and, in a makeshift office in an extra hen house, write stories. As he later joked, "I even thought the plan was sound!" The income wasn't enough to support a family, and when Ruth was three years old, the Doans moved into town, where Dan took a job at a manufacturing company. Although Dan gave up farming, he didn't give up writing. Ruth remembers falling asleep each evening listening to what she later would call "a literary lullaby," the sound of his typewriter as he wrote at night. By the time she was six, she had written her first story and knew that she too was a writer. *The Doane Family Vol. II (#1484iv)*, page 474 gives information on Ruth and Daniel Doan's

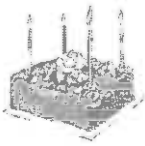
lineage. Daniel, who was born in 1914, died in 1993. He wrote numerous hiking guidebooks, and since his death, Ruth has been updating many of them. Daniel Doan's papers are located at Dartmouth College and much information about him can be garnered from them. Ruth attended Bennington College and graduated from Keene State College. Her husband, Don MacDougall, also graduated from Keene. They lived in England and Boston before returning to New Hampshire, where they have lived ever since. 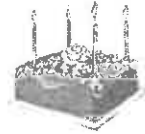
GERRY DOANE ON HOOSIER MILLIONAIRE SHOW

JIM DOAN'S MEMORABILIA COLLECTION

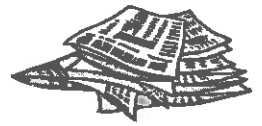

Your editor remembered a paper given by Erma Phillips of California at the 1988 DFA Reunion, checked out the *Proceedings*, and was able to answer this query. Those places, and also Doane

MUSICIAN J. CHALMERS DOANE -- A BARRINGTON DOANE HONOURED

J. Chalmers Doane, C. M. of Maitland, Nova Scotia (#1465aii in *The Doane Family*, Vol. II page 463) has had a long musical career in the Province of Nova Scotia. He was appointed as a Member of the Order of Canada, effective Oct. 29, 2004. This announcement was made by Her Excellency the Right Honourable Adrienne Clarkson, Governor General of Canada.

This appointment was established in 1967 to recognize outstanding achievement and service in various fields of human endeavour. It is Canada's highest honour for lifetime achievement. There are three levels of membership--Companion, Officer, and Member-- that honour people whose accomplishments vary in degree and scope. Chalmers was appointed be a Member, which entitles him to place the initials CM after his name. The achievements of Chalmers, which led up to this honour, are described as follows: "With the help of a ukulele, Chalmers Doane taught thousands of children to play an instrument and experience the joy of music. As a music supervisor in Halifax schools during the 1960s, he introduced this novel approach to education, resulting in an exponential increase in the numbers of students in band, string, and choral music. His innovative pedagogy has been a model to

boards across the country. He has also founded bands and orchestras in the community, and served as a director with Symphony Nova Scotia and the Neptune Theatre. This accomplished musician currently makes music with the jazz-inspired Chalmers Doane Trio, playing the piano, clarinet, and file, as well as the ukulele."

His Doane line back to Deacon John Doane is as follows: John Chalmers, John Ells, Herbert Leander, James Hervey, James, Samuel, Edmund, Israel, Daniel, Daniel, and John 1st.

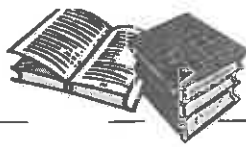
