PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Kay Blair, Historian, and her assistant, Virgil Doan, have their hands full and are working frantically to get the job done. I'm sure you will hear more about this at the 2010 reunion. We are truly sorry about this delay.

Congratulations to our new Regional VP Jerry Fisher in Ontario for organizing a new Niagara Chapter of the Association. He has had some valuable help from Peter Doan, as well as others, I'm sure. We will be pleased to present their Charter at the reunion.

And speaking of the reunion, I'm excited about what has being put together for our members. I am told that the Friday night banquet is going to be a "real" blast, so if you are planning on leaving early, you better change your plans. We are very hopeful of having some of our past/present scholarship recipients at our Tuesday night dinner.



CATRIONA LeMAY DOAN AN OLYMPIC ICON AT THE VANCOUVER 2010 WINTER GAMES

Those of you Doan(e)s who watched the 2010 Olympic Games at Vancouver, B.C., may recall that during the opening ceremony, several prominent people were selected to receive the Olympic Flame as it reached Vancouver, after a 45,000 Kilometer voyage across Canada. The flame was transferred by them from the torch to each of five arms which later formed part of the Olympic Cauldron at Vancouver. One of the prominent persons selected for this honor was our own Catriona LeMay Doan, an Olympic heroine and veteran of four Olympic games, whose accomplishments in champion speed skating events have been recognized by Gold Medals in the Olympics and in World Skating competitions throughout the world. In recognition of her accomplishments, she was made an Officer of the Order of Canada by the Governor General, one of the country's highest honours. In 2002, she earned the Earl Marsh Award as Canada's Athlete of the year.

This remarkable lady was born on 23 December 1970 in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Canada. She makes her home in Calgary, Alberta, with her husband Bart Doan, and their two young children. You may read about her husband's Doan(e) family connection in *The Doane Family*, volume II, #1158, under Albert Urban Doan. DFA Historian Katherine Blair reports that Albert U. Doan's son Melvin "Muff" Doan had several children including Philip Doan the father of Catriona's husband Bart Doan. Melvin's sixth child is Bernard Kent Doan

whose son is Shane Doan of hockey fame.

Since retiring from the racing circuit, Catriona has received three Honorary Degrees: from the University of Calgary, the University of Saskatchewan and the University of Regina. She is a motivational speaker and a bilingual presenter who explores with her audiences the methods of achieving personal excellence and motivating people to achieve at their full potential.

Catriona is actively involved in her community and charitable associations including the Catriona Doan Foundation for Children and Youth, acts as a spokesperson for the Spina Bifida and Hydrocephalus Association of Canada, the Right to Play Athlete Ambassador and Ontario's Lakefield Oval Project. She was appointed to be a Board Member of the Vancouver 2010 Olympics, a Board Member of CODA and the Canadian Centre at Calgary.

She was selected by the official television network for the 2010 Olympic Games by Canada's C.T.V. network and her voice has been heard providing advice to the broadcasters of the Olympic Speed Skating events which took place in the Olympic Oval at Richmond, B.C.

This truly remarkable young woman is certainly deserving of the highest commendation of all members of the Doane Family Association in the United States and Canada.

PRISCILLA DOANE MORSE

November 23, 1911 – March 19, 2010

Priscilla Doane Morse was born in Jacksonville, FL, November 23, 1911, the daughter of Adelbert Franklin Doane, Jr. and Mary Bartlett Doane. Mrs. Morse spent her early years in Beaufort, North Carolina, summering with her sister, Annis while visiting the Bartlett cousins in North Guilford, CT. Following her mothers passing when she was eleven, Priscilla lived with her aunt in Florida. She graduated from Northfield Academy in Northfield, MA, and Gibbs School of Business. She worked as a secretary in Boston for several years sharing an apartment with her sister, Annis and they together spent two years in Illinois working.



Priscilla also lived with her father in Texas before moving back to Guilford to marry Whitney Lester Morse in 1936. They lived in North Guilford in one of the Bartlett houses before moving down town. Mr. Morse ran a small grocery on Route One and they lived over the Sullivan Funeral Home. In 1940 they purchased their home at 55 Graves Ave. Shortly after Mr. Morse sold his store and went to work for the State of Connecticut until 1976. Mrs. Morse lived in their Graves Av. home until her death. Mrs. Morse was proud of her heritage as the descendent of several of the founding planters of Guilford and Deacon John Doane, Eastham, MA, founder of the Doane family in America. She was a life member of the Doane Family Association of America and often shared stories of her background and genealogy. During her marriage Mrs. Morse worked for the Guilford Forge as financial accountant for over twenty-five years, retiring in 1976. She was a member of the Congregational Church Alpha Club and was the church Treasurer during the 1980's. Mrs. Morse was known for her baking

abilities especially the dinner rolls that she baked every year for the church Christmas Fair. She knitted twenty to thirty sweaters each year for this event and contributed sweaters also to the Guilford Senior's Holiday Fair. She allowed use of her garage for Guilford Senior's storage. She made sweaters for her granddaughters and used her sewing abilities to make beautiful dresses and capes for them when they were children. Mrs. Morse was generous to many often making coffee cakes and rolls for friends and neighborhood events. She enjoyed watching tennis on the television and reading; in later years listening to book tapes. She planted and cared for a small vegetable garden until the last three years. Predeceased by her husband, Whitney L. Morse in 1977, Mrs. Morse leaves her son, Whitney Doane Morse and his wife Margaret Berger Morse of Guilford, CT; her daughter, Jane Coe Davis of Waterford, CT; granddaughters, Torrey Priscilla Morse and Jessica Doane Morse, of Guilford, CT; several nieces and nephews in CT, COLO, MA, NH, NY, and WIS; as well as various Bartlett relatives in North Guilford, CT. A private graveside service is being held at Alderbrook Cemetery on April 24, 2010. Mrs. Morse will be missed by all. Donations can be made to Dudley Farm, Guilford, CT.

SHIRLEY PAULINE BREEDEN

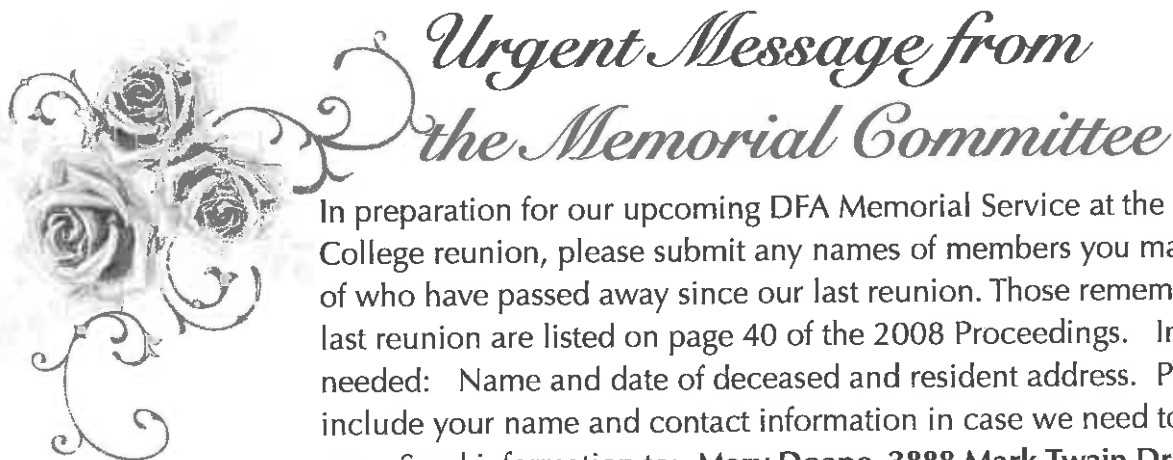

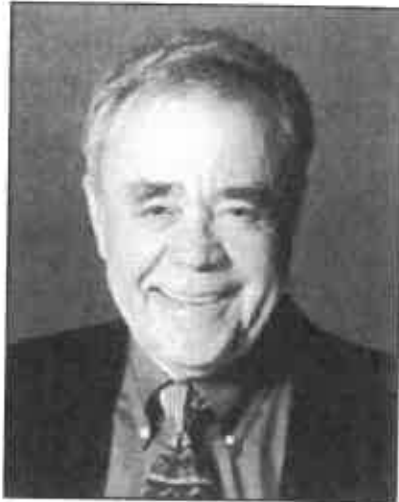
Dr. J. William Doane...

A World-Famous Leader in Flat Display Technology

While working at your computer, watching television, checking your digital watch, or using a calculator, you are most likely reaping the benefits of the work done by Doane family member Dr. J.

William Doane in the field of liquid crystal technology. His research at Kent State University's Liquid Crystal Institute (LCI) catapulted the scientific field of optical electronics into a phenomenon that now dominates the electronics industry. Dr. Doane joined Kent State University in 1965, the year of the LCI's inception. Just out of graduate school, he was a new Assistant Professor in the Department of Physics. Doane found liquid crystal materials fascinating and asked the LCI to synthesize a compound that he could study with nuclear magnetic resonance (NMR). That was the beginning of Dr. Doane's interest in liquid crystals, and by 1967, his entire research program focused on this material. He soon attracted other physics faculty members and graduate students to take an interest in liquid crystals, and academic programs in this field expanded at Kent State. Dr. Doane, was the director of the internationally known Liquid Crystal Institute at Kent State University from 1983-1996. During that time, he led the effort to establish the National Science Foundation Center for Advanced Liquid Crystalline Optical Materials (ALCOM). As an active member of the international science community, he has held visiting appointments and maintained cooperative research programs in several countries, including the University of Ljubljana in Slovenia, Australian National University in Canberra, and University of New South Wales in Sydney. A Fellow of the American Physical Society (1982), Dr. Doane has authored 200 articles and holds ten patents.

Dr. Doane is now Emeritus Director of the Liquid Crystal Institute and Emeritus Professor of Physics and Chemical Physics at the university. He retired



from Kent State in 1996 after a 31-year teaching and administrative career. Doane is also the co-founder and chief technology officer of Kent Displays, Inc., and a world renowned expert in the field of liquid crystal materials and devices. In 1993, together with William Manning, of Manning Ventures of Rochester, NY, he co-founded Kent Displays, Inc.

Dr. Doane was instrumental in formalizing the International Liquid Crystal Society and served as the organization's first treasurer from 1990-1996. He served on the editorial board of Liquid Crystals and on the board of directors of OIS Optical Imaging Systems. One of Dr. Doane's most recent awards was the inaugural presentation of the Slottow-Owaki Prize for Display Education at the Society for Information Display's 2007 annual conference. He maintains research laboratories at the LCI on optics and display applications of liquid crystalline materials, and participates actively in conferences of the Society for Information Display.
